#### **Project Background and Rationale**



The extension program integrates activities such as Basic Navigation and Seamanship Course and Modified Basic Safety Training, both essential components mandated by MARINA for issuing seafarers identification book to fisherfolks operating below 35 GT boats.

Bloodletting contributes to community health by facilitating blood donations that can be life-saving in emergencies and medical procedures. This activity ensures a sufficient blood supply for hospitals and healthcare facilities, supporting critical healthcare needs.

Coastal cleanup initiatives play a crucial role in environmental conservation by removing debris, trash, and pollutants from coastal areas. By safeguarding marine life, ecosystems, and maintaining clean beaches, coastal cleanup promotes community involvement in preserving coastal areas and raises awareness about the importance of protecting our oceans for future generations.



For this reason, other colleges and programs of ZSCMST may also render their extension services with the barangay while CME will continue its commitment to the barangay in extending developed technologies for livelihood training and other technical assistance requested.

Along this line, the College of Maritime Education through its different programs will prepare a three-year plan for the College Extension. The College programs will draw plans and projects within their line of expertise and implement them within the target implementation period. Projects previously conducted shall still continue to form part of the extension program for monitoring and evaluation to determine its impact on the community.

## ADEQUATE AND RELEVANT PROJECTS/ACTIVITIES TO ACHIEVE OBJECTIVES



The Zamboanga State College of Marine Sciences and Technology-College of Maritime Education extension specifically on Bachelor of Science in Marine Transportation focuses on skills training and enhancement program on Basic Navigation and Seamanship as well as the Modified Basic Safety Training among the fisher folks of Barangay Mampang. This extension program was relevant to their needs with regards to the nature of their livelihood activities on the sea on how to properly navigate their fishing boat and how to respond to emergency situations in case untoward incidents happen in the middle of the sea.

Navigation is the art and science of safely and efficiently directing the movements of a vessel from one point to another. Piloting uses water depth and visible references, while dead reckoning uses courses and distances from the last known position. Seamanship is the art of operating a vessel. Specifically, it is a compilation of the skills and knowledge entailed in navigation, boat handling, maintenance, and the law of the sea. It involves working as part of a crew and when the occasion arises, leading a crew in the role of a skipper.

The Modified Basic Safety Training Course (MBSTC) refers to a customized version with typhoon training course developed by the MARINA of the IMO basic safety training course for seafarers, other vessel personnel complement onboard vessels below 35 GT.

By providing fisher folks with basic navigation, seamanship, and safety training tailored to their needs, we can empower them to navigate safely, protect their livelihoods, and contribute to sustainable fishing practices.


This extension program would provide a comprehensive education in navigation, seamanship, and safety, preparing participants for roles in the maritime industry that require advanced skills and knowledge.

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## Two Day Extension Program in Basic Navigation and Seamanship Course with Modified Basic Training, February 24-25, 2024

From February 24th - 25th, 2024, the College of Maritime Education, in partnership with MARINA Region 9, organized a comprehensive two-day extension program focused on Basic Navigation and Seamanship with Modified Basic Training. Held in Barangay Mampang, Zamboanga City, this initiative aimed to equip participants, including fisherfolks and maritime students, with essential skills and knowledge for safe and efficient maritime operations. By bringing together fisherfolks and maritime students as participants and facilitators, the program fostered knowledge exchange and community engagement, empowering participants with essential skills and expertise.

## Releasing of Seafarers Identification Book November 15, 2024

On November 15, 2024 at Barangay Mampang, Zamboanga City, ten fisherfolks received their Seafarers Identification Books (SIB) after completing the Basic Navigation and Seamanship Course with Modified Basic Training. This achievement was made possible through the sponsorship of the Maritime Education Parents Program Foundation, Inc., which covered the cost of the SIBs. This milestone is a significant step for the fisherfolks, providing them with important credentials to advance their maritime careers.

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Looking ahead, the college has exciting plans in store. Following the release of the Seafarer's Identification Book, the next step will be securing *Fisherfolk License IDs* for eligible individuals. After two to three years, fisherfolk will be able to upgrade their SIB certification to become *boat captains*. This requires two years of sea service on any ship, regardless of its size.

Additionally, the college plans to enter into a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with MARINA to conduct the Basic Navigation and Seamanship Course with Modified Basic Training. The implementation of the Sibuco Program in Basic Navigation and Seamanship with Modified Basic Training, conducted by the College of Maritime Education in collaboration with MARINA at Zamboanga del Norte, holds immense value not only for Zamboanga City but also for the broader regional area. This initiative aims to empower fisherfolk and enhance their skills, equipping them with essential knowledge in navigation, seamanship, and safety protocols, thereby fostering safer and more efficient maritime activities. By extending the program's reach to neighboring regions, it addresses the wider need for sustainable practices and safety awareness among coastal communities, where fishing and small-scale maritime operations are vital economic activities. Moreover, the program also benefits the vessels themselves, as the adoption of proper navigation techniques and safety measures reduces risks of accidents, damage, and loss. Through this regional approach, the program not only uplifts individual livelihoods but also strengthens maritime industry standards, contributing to economic resilience and sustainability in the region.

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## MARINO Techs (Mariners Advancing Regional Industries through Novel Technologies) Extension program Welding and Wiring Training, December 15-17, 2023

The College of Maritime Education completed its first project as part of the MARINO Techs (Mariners Advancing Regional Industries through Novel Technologies) Extension program, Welding and Wiring Training conducted at Barangay Mampang.With this course, participants will obtain a better grasp of the right manner to conduct welding and wiring operations, which they can utilize to earn a living.



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From **December 15 to 17, 2023**, CME Extension Program conducted a **Welding and Wiring Training** at Barangay Mampang, aimed at enhancing the technical skills of participants through hands-on learning and practical application. This training focused on developing essential competencies required in both industries, ensuring that participants are equipped to meet professional standards and workplace demands.

#### Welding Training

Participants were trained in the following key areas:

- Applying safety practices and ensuring workplace safety.
- Interpreting technical drawings and performing industry calculations.
- Preparing weld materials, setting up equipment, and fitting materials.
- Using hand tools effectively and contributing to quality systems.
- Learning proper techniques for welding and repairing welds.

#### Wiring Training


The wiring module provided participants with competencies in:

- Operating hand tools and performing accurate mensuration and calculations.
- Preparing and interpreting electrical drawings and applying quality standards.
- Terminating and connecting electrical wiring and electronic circuits safely and efficiently.

This training aimed to empower participants with the knowledge and skills to take on real-world tasks confidently. Through expert instruction and practical exercises, the program emphasized safety, precision, and quality, contributing to the professional growth of every trainee.

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

#### Welding Workshop by Engr. Jayson

After covering the theoretical aspects of welding on Day 1, Engr. Ronilo Jayson proceeded to demonstrate the practical application of welding techniques, emphasizing the importance of safety protocols—an area where many welders often lack knowledge.

Once the demonstration was completed, participants were provided with the necessary tools and materials and were tasked to apply what they had learned through individual practice. Each trainee was instructed to perform various welding strokes to refine their handling skills and improve their timing, ensuring they develop confidence and precision in their technique.





#### Wiring Workshop by R/O Espina

Following the theoretical input on Day 1, R/O Jesus Espina guided participants through the practical aspects of creating basic wiring connections. He demonstrated the correct methods for building parallel, series, and multiple connections while emphasizing the importance of safety practices to prevent electric shock—one of the most common injuries caused by a lack of awareness during wiring tasks.

After the demonstration, participants were assigned to apply their learning by creating wiring connections based on the instructions provided, reinforcing their understanding and hands-on skills.

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#### **Output Presentation (Welding)**

The welding participants successfully crafted a metal-framed chair designed to seat 2 to 3 people. Throughout the process, they received guidance from Engr. Ronilo Jayson and passed his initial assessment, demonstrating their application of the skills they acquired during the workshop.



#### **Output Presentation (Wiring)**

Participants of the wiring training designed and assembled their own connection boards following the guidelines and instructions provided by R/O Jesus Espina. Each board featured various connections and diagrams, showcasing the participants' understanding and application of the concepts learned during the workshop

### Phase 3 Welding and Wiring Training ZSCMST Campus (June 15 and 22, September 21 and 28, October 5 and 19, November 5, 2024)

The "MARINO Techs" Extension Program is an initiative of the College of Maritime Education (CME) aimed at equipping participants with essential technical skills in Welding and Electrical Installation and Maintenance. Aligned with the standards set by the Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA), this program is designed to prepare trainees for the National Certificate Level II (NC II) Assessment, enhancing their qualifications and employability in the maritime and industrial sectors.

The program commenced on June 15, 2024, and conclude on November 9, 2024, following several months of intensive hands-on training. It accommodates 10 trainees in Welding and 3 trainees in Wiring (Electrical Installation and Maintenance). Each participant undergoes structured modules focusing on practical techniques, industry best practices, and safety protocols, ensuring they meet the competencies required for TESDA accreditation.

Through the MARINO Techs Extension Program, the CME extends its commitment beyond the classroom, empowering individuals with specialized technical skills essential for personal and professional growth. This initiative also strengthens the college's mission to produce competent, globally competitive professionals ready to excel in their fields.

As part of our school's drive for continuous improvement and community engagement, this program exemplifies our dedication to training excellence. Its outcomes will contribute meaningfully to our accreditation process, showcasing the effectiveness of CME's initiatives in aligning education with industry standards.

#### Wiring (Electrical Installation and Maintenance)

During the MARINO Techs training, participants will engage in a series of hands-on activities aligned with the core competencies required by TESDA. Specifically, trainees in Electrical Installation and Maintenance will:

- Perform roughing-in activities, wiring, and cabling for single-phase distribution, power, lighting, and auxiliary systems.
- Install electrical protective devices for distribution systems, including lightning protection and grounding.
- Install wiring devices such as floor and wall-mounted outlets, lighting fixtures, switches, and auxiliary outlets.
- These tasks will provide participants with the practical skills necessary to meet industry standards and prepare them for the TESDA NC II Assessment, ensuring they gain both technical proficiency and safety awareness.

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
#### Welding

During the MARINO Techs training, participants in the Welding Program will focus on mastering core competencies required for TESDA NC II. Specifically, trainees will:

- Weld carbon steel plates and pipes using Shielded Metal Arc Welding (SMAW) techniques.
- Perform fillet and groove welds in various positions to meet industry standards.
- Apply proper welding procedures to ensure high-quality and structurally sound welds.

- Follow safety protocols to handle welding equipment and materials effectively.
- These practical exercises aim to prepare trainees for the TESDA NC II Assessment, equipping them with the necessary skills for career opportunities in the maritime, industrial, and construction sectors.

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## Construction of MARINO Techs Metal works and Repair shop (Income generating project) March- October 2024

In March 2024, the construction of a small workshop began at the residence of Elisberto Arieta in Barangay Mampang. This shop was established as part of the income-generating initiative for the participants of the CME MARINO Techs Extension Program: Welding Training. The goal was to provide a sustainable livelihood for the beneficiaries through welding and metalworks services, empowering them to contribute to their community and improve their economic standing.

The shop, now fully operational as of October 2024, is managed by Elisberto Arieta along with his nephews Jayson and Jayvee Arieta, and supported by skilled workers Nick Santos and Hamillton Ballovar. Each member brings unique expertise in welding and fabrication, and together, they have quickly formed a dynamic team committed to delivering quality products and services.

The shop's first major job order was a custom-made cage for a fighting rooster, a popular item in the local community. Jayvee Arieta took charge of the project, ensuring that the cage was built to the specifications requested by the customer. The total cost for the cage was 3,500 pesos, with 2,000 pesos allocated for materials and 1,500 pesos for labor. This first order not only marked the successful launch of the shop's operations but also signaled the potential for future projects in the growing demand for custom metal works in Barangay Mampang.

As the shop continues to grow, Elisberto and his team aim to expand their client base, offering services such as custom metal gates, furniture, and other welded products. The project has proven to be a promising source of income, providing the beneficiaries with stable livelihoods and helping to foster a sense of self-reliance and community pride.

## Fig. 6. Responses on Risk Assessment Questions by respondents







# A. DISCUSSION:

Needs assessment Results shows that 37.5% of the respondents belong to age bracket of 51-60 years old and 29.1% from age bracket of 41-50 and the least, 4.2% from ages 30 to 20 and below. The dominant respondents were female that comprises 58.3% while male 41.7% (**Fig 1**). Majority of the respondents are married (66.7%), Single comprises 20.80% and 4.2% widows. In terms of number of children, two (2) children per family is 23.8% followed by three (3) and four (4) by 19% and 14.4% respectively. All the rest by 9.5% The lowest was from six (6) children and above 4.2% (*Fig 2.).* In terms of education 20.8% of the respondents are either High School level or High School graduates. 16.7% are elementary level and those that had 1-2 years in college. Only 4.2% are trade technical graduate. By employment 39.20% are unemployed, 21.7% other forms of livelihood, 17.4% are seaweeds farmer and fisherman and only 4.3% were able land job on private companies. (*Fig. 3*)

Majority of the respondents are Zamboangeños (78.3%) followed by visayans (13%) and Ilokano 8.7%. Christianity hold vast majority followed by other faiths *(Fig. 4).* On income, 36.8% earn below three (3) thousand per month, 21.1% from four thousand one to five thousand, while about 15.8% (3,001-4,000) per month. The highest paid from the salary bracket of 6,001-7,000 per month is only 5.3% of the respondents *(Fig. 5).* 

Among the responses on the risk assessment which involves political scenario, job opportunities and changes in the government policy on providing livelihood training, majority of the responded affirmatively except on questions on allocated budget and support for livelihood programs majority responses with negative and with low rating of affirmation on the barangay support on livelihood projects (*Fig. 6*).

On short term courses, (Baking and pastry production) top the list, followed by combination of (small boat building, Training on minced fish processing, and Commercial cooking. Next in line of the priority choices was Boat building, Baking and Pastry production. Others like were

equally important but on the last list of respondents priority (Training on fruit and vegetables preservation, Operation of navigation and fishing) On livelihood training, majority favours Baking and Cooking, followed by Fish processing and preservation products, Food processing and preservation products and the least is on others like electricity training for livelihood (*Fig.* 7).

Among other trainings, skills enhancement seminars top their choices followed by Entrepreneurship and combination of packaging and labelling and skills enhancement seminars. There are other choices made which are not within the mandate of the college thus there were listed only as others. Financial equity top on the choice of respondents (*Fig. 8*).

The Barangay council of Mampang also provided Barangay profile data and socio-economic characteristics of the community. Summary of the responses are presented below on *Table 1* & *Table 2* respectively.

In the barangay profile it was indicated that the dominant family size is in the bracket of 4-7 family members in the household followed by 1-3 members and the least is 11 and up members in the family. As far as religion majority embraces Christianity and follows by Islam as the second. Minority are those that belong to other Christian related faith. There are seventeen concerns the barangay identified and with the available amenities. Financial, Housing and Marital issues are three (3) of the most common problem identified by the barangay.

#### WITNESSETH THAT:

WHEREAS, the First and Second Party hereby agreed to the terms and conditions stipulated hereunder relative to the ADOPT-A-BARANGAY PROGRAM of the Zamboanga State College of Marine Sciences and Technology (ZSCMST) through its colleges namely: College of Fisheries and Marine Sciences, College of Maritime Education, College of Education and Liberal Arts, and College of Management and Technology.

WHEREAS, the First party is an institution for higher learning, research, development and innovation in fisheries, marine sciences, maritime education and technology and its mission is to provide quality education and relevant research and extension to produce globally competitive capital for fisheries and marine-based industries;





# MARINA Circular No. 2010 - 02

Insurance for Seafarer's Identification Book (SIRB) holders onboard Philippineregistered vessels weighing less than 35 gross tons (gt) is an important part of maritime employment, ensuring sailors' welfare and protection throughout their service at sea. While individual regulations and policies may differ, broad principles govern the insurance provisions for these seafarers. In essence, insurance for SIRB holders aboard Philippine-registered vessels under 35 gt acts as a safety net, ensuring that seafarers are covered and supported in the case of unforeseen occurrences while doing their duties at sea. Adherence to rules, accurate documentation, and clear communication among all parties involved are critical to guaranteeing the efficacy of this insurance policy.

## MARINA Circular No. 2010 - 02

TO: All Shipping Companies, Fishing Companies, Seafarers, and All Concerned

SUBJECT : RULES IN THE ISSUANCE OF A SEAFARER'S IDENTIFICATION BOOK (SIB) FOR SEAFARERS ONBOARD PHILIPPINE-REGISTERED VESSELS BELOW 35 GT

Pursuant to PD 474, Section 12 Paragraph (j) of Executive Order No. 125-A, these guidelines on the issuance of Seafarer's Identification Book (SIB) for seafarers onboard Philippine-registered vessels below 35 GT is hereby adopted:

### I. OBJECTIVES

- 1. To further enhance the safety of life of the passengers onboard vessels; and
- To prescribe the policies and minimum requirements in the issuance of SIB.

## II. COVERAGE/EXEMPTION

- These rules shall apply to every seafarer as defined herein and who is engaged in any capacity onboard a Philippine-registered vessel below 35 GT;
- 1.2 Seafarers onboard warships, naval vessels, naval auxiliaries and other government-registered ships are exempted from the application of these rules:

## **III. DEFINITION OF TERMS**

1. MARINA - refers to the Maritime Industry Authority.

Modified Basic Safety Training Course (MBSTC)

– refers to a

- Seafarer's Identification Book (SIB) refers to the document issued by the MARINA to all Filipino seafarers and other ship personnel complement onboard vessels below 35 GT.
- Seafarer refers to any person who is employed or engaged or works in any capacity onboard a vessel.

### IV. GENERAL PROVISIONS

- The minimum qualification requirements for the issuance of SIB are as follows: a) must be a Filipino citizen, and b) 18 years of age.
- 2. All seafarers covered by this Circular must be properly documented and shall possess valid SIB at all times.
- All maritime enterprises operating Philippine-registered vessels below 35 GT shall ensure that seafarers onboard their vessels possess valid SIB.
- All applications for the issuance of SIB shall be filed personally by the applicant to MARINA or in any of its recognized service providers.
- The MARINA, upon the request of shipping/fishing companies/ operators and other maritime entities, may dispatch the MARINA SIB Mobile Team for on-site processing.
- 6. All seafarers covered by this Circular shall be required to undergo the Modified Basic Safety Training Course (MBSTC) in comic version with typhoon awareness which shall be conducted by MTC-accredited training centers and PAMTCI member training centers
- Retraining shall be required of holder of MBSTC for seafarer who has not served onboard for at least a year within five (5) years from the date of issuance of MBSTC certificates or date of last disembarkation;
- Seafarers who have gone onboard for at least one (1) year in the last five (5) years will no longer be required to present the MBSTC certificates when they apply for re-issuance of or replacement of lost SIB.

#### VIII. RESPONSIBILITIES OF OPERATORS/ SHIPPING COMPANIES/ MANNING AGENCIES/ MARITIME INSTITUTIONS/ SEAFARERS

- 1. All shipping companies/ manning agencies/operators covered by this Circular shall ensure:
  - That all Filipino seafarers onboard Philippine-registered vessels shall hold valid SIB at all times;
  - b. The genuineness and authenticity of all documents and supporting papers of every seafarer where the application is endorsed by the operators/shipping company/manning
  - c. That the seafarers shall be engaged/shall provide services w due regard to the applicable limitations specified in the SIB.
- 2. All seafarers covered by this Circular shall:

### a. Secure a valid SIB before going on board/ joining-a vessel.

b. Submit authentic documents and/or papers in support of his application for the issuance of SIB.

### IX. ADMINISTRATIVE SANCTIONS

- 1. A seafarer's SIB may be suspended/revoked after due process for any of the following grounds:
  - 1.1 Suspension of SIB:
    - 2.1.1 Negligence or incapacity in the performance of duty;
    - 2.1.2 Intemperate habits such as drunkenness tending to cause immediate loss or destruction or serious damage to the vessel or tending to endanger the life of any person organic to or passenger of such vessel;
    - 2.1.3 Insubordination or direct assault;
    - 2.1.4 Violations of the terms and conditions of the contract without just cause;
    - 2.1.5 Repeated violations of any of the provisions of this

## XI. STANDARD PROCESSING TIME

All SIB applications shall be subject to the following:

- Expedite released within four (4) working hours reckoned from the time of evaluation;
- Regular released within eight (8) working hours reckoned from the time of evaluation;

#### XII. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE

Should any part of these Rules be declared null and void, the same shall not affect the validity of the remaining part.

### XIII. TRANSITORY PERIOD

In order to foster effective implementation of the herein guidelines, MARINA shall commence the conduct of MBST in comic version with typhoon awareness programs required for the issuance of SIB for seafarers onboard vessels below 35 GT by 15 January 2011.

By 01 July 2011, all operators/shipping companies, fishing companies, seafarers, and all concerned, shall have complied with the requirements of this Circular.

### XIV. EFFECTIVITY

This Circular shall take effect fifteen (15) calendar days upon its publications once in a newspaper of general circulation.







# Basic Navigation and Seamanship Course with Modified Basic Safety Training under the MARINO TECHs Extension Program

Captain Marnette M. Apit conducted a follow-up visit to the MARINA three months later to monitor the project's progress last July 19, 2024.

During the visitation, Captain Apit discovered that, following the program, no fisherfolk returned to the MARINA to secure their insurance as SIRB holders aboard Philippine-registered vessels under 35 GT. This insurance acts as a crucial safety net, ensuring that seafarers are protected and supported in unforeseen circumstances while performing their duties at sea. Captain Apit expressed concern over this lack of engagement, emphasizing the need for better outreach and education to encourage fisherfolk to take advantage of these essential safety provisions.


On March 5, 2024, a face-to-face interview was conducted at the Elisberto residence with participants of the MARINO Techs Welding Program, one of whom is a beneficiary and adopter of the initiative. A total of five adopters were interviewed individuallyfour specializing in welding and one in electrical wiring.

During the interviews, it was revealed that the participants were able to apply the skills acquired from the training in sideline jobs and their daily activities. Although the income generated from these sidelines is modest, the participants expressed their intention to continue to the next phase of the program. This next stage will serve as a preparatory step for TESDA accreditation, which will qualify them to obtain NC I and NC II certifications upon successful assessment.

## Income Report and Background of Mr. Elisberto and Mr. Jayvee Arieta (2023)

The table above presents the income of Mr. Elisberto and Mr. Jayvee Arieta for 2023, with the majority of their earnings generated from small welding projects.

## Background

Both Mr. Elisberto and Mr. Jayvee Arieta participated in the 2019 Extension Welding Program. After the pandemic, Mr. Elisberto successfully applied his welding skills to his shop, which primarily focuses on motorcycle repair and customization. The training enabled him to increase his income by taking on additional customer projects, particularly in custom accessories.

In the second quarter of 2023, Mr. Elisberto expanded his operations by hiring his nephew, Mr. Jayvee Arieta, who also completed the same welding program. Initially, Mr. Jayvee took on sideline welding jobs in Barangay Lapuyan, located on the East Coast of Zamboanga. However, the high travel costs between his residence in Barangay Mampang and Lapuyan made it challenging to sustain his income. As a result, he decided to join his uncle's shop in May 2023.

Currently, Mr. Elisberto and Mr. Jayvee operate their shop using a pakyawan (projectbased) system, accepting welding and repair jobs. To support their livelihood and enhance their operations, the CME Marino Techs Extension Program donated materials and basic equipment, enabling them to establish the Marino Techs Metals Works and Repair Shop. This new facility not only strengthens their capacity to take on more metalworking projects but also provides future adopters of the CME Marino Techs Program with opportunities to develop their skills and improve their income.

## Jayvee Arieta's Journey

Jayvee Arieta's story is one of perseverance and determination. In December 2023, he embarked on a life-changing path by enrolling in a welding training program offered by the "MARINO Techs" Extension Program. Building on this foundation, he committed to advancing his skills, successfully completing the next phase of training between June and November 2024.

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Armed with hands-on experience and a comprehensive skill set from the program, Jayvee set out to find meaningful employment. His dedication paid off when he was hired as a contractual Mechanic Maintenance worker at the Coca-Cola factory. One of the key factors in securing this position was the quality of training he received at MARINO Techs, which greatly enhanced his credentials.

Jayvee's uncle, Mr. Elisberto Arieta, also played a pivotal role in this milestone by providing a strong recommendation that highlighted Jayvee's work ethic and capabilities. Today, Jayvee takes pride in his new role, maintaining and repairing machinery at the factory. His journey serves as a testament to the transformative power of education, skill-building, and unwavering support from family.

## Adaptors of 2023 CME-MARINO Techs Extension Welding and Wiring Program

## **Ely Barrera**

Ely utilizes his training as a source of additional income. A senior high school student specializing in automotive at Talon-Talon National High School, he assists his uncle on welding and other tasks during weekends and free days. For each job completed, he earns between 300 and 350 pesos.

## **Norellenitzel Fidel**

Norellenitzel takes on welding jobs at his home on a project-based arrangement. His earnings vary depending on the size of the project. Occasionally, he collaborates with Ely Barrera on welding tasks from neighbors. Recently, they worked on assembling and attaching a sidecar to a motorcycle, expecting a payment of 2,000 pesos.

## **Jayson Cristobal**

Jayson applies his training by taking on welding jobs under the Pakyawan system. Operating from his residence, he earns an average of 1,500 pesos monthly.

## **Ronan Kleford Estrada**

Ronan, a working student attending an ALS program, takes on construction projects during his free time. He earns about 350 pesos per job and also incorporates his welding training into his construction work.

## **Vincent Alberca**

Vincent works as a welder on a part-time basis, leveraging his recently acquired skills. His monthly income ranges between 5,000 and 8,000 pesos. Currently, he is involved in a house construction project for a relative, operating under a project-based arrangement with steel framework.

## **Rocelo Asajar**

Rocelo, though currently unemployed, performs basic wiring installations in his community. After completing training from MARINO Techs, his confidence and job opportunities in wiring installations grew. He typically earns 200 pesos per project.

## **Ramelecion Trupa**

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Ramelecion specializes in small-scale wiring installations and repairs for neighbors. His earnings average around 300 pesos per project.

All participants have less knowledge and understanding of welding and wiring. But through MARINO Techs, they gained additional knowledge and understanding in these fields. They all wanted to proceed with the Phase 3 program, which gave them a chance to acquire the NC 2 certificate from TESDA. And by acquiring these certificates, they have a bigger chance to acquire a permanent and sustainable job in the future.

As presented in Table 2, the monitoring and evaluation of the CME extension activities on Skills Training on Metal Arc-Welding as of 2023, 4 out 28 or 14.29% of the participants were able to find a job as a worker who works for an employer, under contract where an individual undertakes to do personal work or services as a welder with a salary depending on the number of days they rendered. One of them decided to pursue a college degree and became a full time student and the other one migrated outside of Zamboanga City.

On the Skills Training on Building Wiring and Maintenance, there was 1 out of 28, or 3.57% of the participants was able to land a job as an electrician under contract with a salary also depending on the number of days they rendered.

On the other hand, our beneficiaries were able to gain knowledge on the awareness of proper ways on conducting wiring and welding operation. Also gained knowledge on Basic First Aid for burn, Electric shock and other types of injuries that can be encountered on Welding and Wiring Operation if negligence occurs.

## Impact Assessment of the Project

– all project funded and implemented by the different colleges will be subjected to impact assessment by the Director of Training and Extension and his staff after a year of completion of the project. This is to determine whether or not our presence in a certain barangay was felt by the people of the said barangay and that whether the quality of their lives improved because of our interventions.





## Two-Day Extension Program in Basic Navigation and Seamanship Course with Modified Basic Safety Training on February 24-25, 2024







Abdract— This paper studies on the harmonic distortion and the methods to mitigate the harmonics for a system with Load variation and different harmonic distortion level. A group of passive shund lifter are designed to reduce harmonic distortion and correct power factor. The proposed method optimize the group filter configuration which is suitable for load and distortion level variation to get best scenario out of passive harmonic filters. Naximum level for power factor as long as it is positive, consider as constraint and minimizing harmonics distortion index such as Yoad Harmonic Distortion (HD) and its Individual Harmonic Distortion (HD) content are factors for objective function. Genetic Agorithm has been used as Optimization technique and software to simulate are MATLAB for genetic algorithm and ETAP for filter simulation in power system.

These harmonics can cause problems ranging from telephone transmission interference to degradation of conductors and insulating material in motors and transformers. Therefore it is important to gauge the total effect of these harmonics [2]. Schwanz and Bollen have conducted a comprehensive review on solutions of harmonic

mitigation techniques using active and passive filters [3]. Jain and Sing estimated harmonics in modern power systems narrowing down key issues and challenges [4]. A paper presented by Adel M Sharaff, Michael E. Fisher a novel optimization design technique for power system shaut filters to ensure harmonic reduction and noise mitigation on the electrical utility grid. The proposal filter design is based on the minimization of a composite objective function depicting the three main filter objectives of minimum harmonic current absorption by the harmonic filter and minimum harmonic voltage distortion at points of common counting.
